# Schedule of fees

As at 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024

The following fees will be charged from the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2024.

### Enterprise fees – beef

All beef processor Enterprises are required to pay an annual licence fee, which is based on the average number of head graded in the previous fiscal year.

#### 1) From 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024

The licence fee will cover the following services:

- MSA Integrity checks conducted by the Authorised Authority
- MSA Grader sign-off and support services conducted by the Authorised Authority
- MSA Business Development services
- myMSA system access and supporting tools and analytics
- MyFeedback access for comprehensive carcass feedback and reporting
- MSA Communications and operations support

### MSA saleyards

From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024, no licence fees will be charged for MSA licensed saleyards. Audit fees will be charged by the Authorised Authority.

### MSA Independent Boning Rooms

From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024, audit fees will be charged by the Authorised Authority.

### MSA licensed Third party software developers

All MSA licensed third party software developers are required to pay a software access fee of \$5,000 + GST, payable on initial execution of each third party software licence agreement, to gain access to the current version of either the MSA beef or sheepmeat model.

### Technical services

Service fees will be charged to cover expenses incurred by the Authorised Authority when providing technical services to an Enterprise.
