Detailed economic analyses of goat production systems in rangeland Queensland have been conducted by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries, Queensland (DAF Qld) staff as part of a project funded by the Queensland Government's Drought and Climate Adaptation Program. This webinar especially for the goat industry explores methods to appropriately assess the impact of strategies on profit, risk, and the time period before benefits can be expected.
